

VIOLENT DEATHS AMONG ASIANS AND PACIFIC ISLANDER RESIDENTS IN NORTH CAROLINA: 2014-2023

The North Carolina Violent Death Reporting System (NC-VDRS) is a CDC-funded statewide surveillance system that collects detailed information on violent deaths that occur in North Carolina including: homicide, suicide, unintentional firearm deaths, legal intervention, and deaths of undetermined intent. NC-VDRS uses information from death certificates, medical examiner reports, and law enforcement reports to understand and aid in the prevention of violent deaths. 
Violent Death Rate by Race/Ethnicity: NC-VDRS, 2014-2023




- For the year 2023, there were 393,382 non-Hispanic (NH) Asian and Pacific Islander residents living in North Carolina, accounting for 3.6% of the state's population.
- NH Asian and Pacific Islander victims had the lowest rate of violent death by race/ethnicity in North Carolina for the vears 2014-2023 (9.9 per 100.000 population).

- ** Rate per 100,000 population
- From 2014 to 2023, 322 NH Asian and Pacific Islander residents died by violence.
- There were 71 homicides (22.1%), 240 suicides (74.5%), three unintentional firearm deaths (0.9%), two deaths due to legal interventions (0.6%), and six deaths of undetermined intent (1.9%) among NH Asian and Pacific Islander residents.
- Male NH Asian and Pacific Islander residents were over two times more likely to die by violence than females from 2014 to 2023 (69.9% versus 30.1%).

Manner of Death Among NH Asians & Pacific Islander Victims: NC-VDRS, 2014-2023




Manner of Death by Race/Ethnicity, NC-VDRS, 2014-2023



- NH Asian and Pacific Islander victims accounted for 0.9% of all homicide and 1.7% of all suicide victims, across all racial groups in North Carolina from 2014 to 2023.
- In contrast, NH White victims accounted for 82.8% of all suicides, and NH Black victims accounted for 61.7% of all homicides, across all racial groups in North Carolina from 2014 to 2023.


Method of Death Among NH Asian and Pacific Islander




- The majority of homicides (69.0%) among NH Asian and Pacific Islander victims involved firearms.
- The second most common method of homicide was sharp instruments (9.9%).
- The most common method of suicide was hanging, strangulation or suffocation (40.8%), followed by those involving firearms (36.7%).
- * Other includes fire/burns, falls, intentional neglect, personal weapons and other methods

- Of all homicides among NH Asian and Pacific Islander victims with known circumstance information, over two-fifths (40.3%) of these were precipitated by another serious crime (e.g., robbery, burglary).
- An argument or conflict precipitated
 29.9% of homicides among NH Asian and
 Pacific Islander victims.
- Among NH Asian and Pacific Islander homicide victims, 26.9% were related to intimate partner violence.

Suicide Circumstances* Among NH Asians & Pacific Islander Victims: NC-VDRS, 2014-2023



- Among NH Asian and Pacific Islander suicide victims with known circumstance information, 42.0% experienced a recent crisis.
- Three in ten (29.7%) NH Asian and Pacific Islander suicide victims were characterized as being depressed at the time of suicide.
- Under thirty percent (28.3%) of suicide victims were receiving treatment for a mental health problem, and 19.6% disclosed their intent of suicide.
- Twenty-seven percent (26.5%) of NH Asian and Pacific Islander suicide victims experienced a recent problem with an intimate partner.
