If the employee is on the make line, they are not changing tasks.The employee in the example did change tasks and handwashing was required prior to applying new gloves.	
The cooling rate is for an intervention, right? Can't mark them on it until after the time expires?	The cooling rate calculation is one of many assessment tools used to evaluate the facility's cooling methods and processes.

When doing HACCP verification for rice acidification during one of these educational visits, would having employee verify calibration of pH meter and testing current batch of rice be appropriate for the HACCP verification, or should we be only reviewing HACCP and records?	The HACCP review during an EV includes making sure the facility has a copy of their HACCP Plan, a valid approval (local approval or approval letter from the Variance Committee) and required record- keeping. It is possible to conduct a HACCP verification during this visit. Use the HACCP verification form provided by DHHS or other applicable form to document the verification. A comment addendum documenting the educational visit will still need to be completed and submitted for credit.	Have the employee verify the calibration of the pH meter and testing the current batch of rice is also appropriate during a HACCP verification.

It's kind of my understanding that the Edu visit is a reaction, and not quite a front-end preventative measure.
