

American Red Cross Training

To access/ register for free online training modules provided by the American Red Cross follow the instructions found on the Red Cross EDGE Registration Link and Guide.

After registration, you can access EDGE at: https://arc.csod.com using your username and password.

Once you have logged in:

- 1. Enter any of the course names below in the search bar to bring up that course request.
- 2. Be sure to request **online web training** (options with the blue computer icon) and not the instructor-led class training.
- 3. The estimated length of time to complete each course is listed in the description.

It is recommended that all public health nurses and staff providing shelter support consider taking the two online courses below:

1. Shelter Fundamentals: v2 (07/10/2024) 1 hour:

 Shelter Fundamentals is a basic level course that introduces the guidelines and procedures for setting up, running, and closing a shelter during a disaster.
 Referencing shelter checklists, participants will work on a case study that takes them through four of the six phases of the Sheltering Process: Resourcing, Opening, Operating, and Closing.

2. Disaster Cycle Services: An Overview (12/06/2023) 25 minutes:

This course provides an overview of how Disaster Cycle Services (DCS) fulfills the Red
Cross mission and describes the whole cycle process of helping individuals families
and communities to prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters. This course
also reviews the role of community and government partners and describes
opportunities for volunteers and disaster cycle services.

Additionally, there are two other courses to help public health nurses and shelter staff assist clients with behavioral health and functional needs during a shelter response:

1. Psychological First Aid: Helping Others in Times of Stress: (2/5/24) 1 hour

 Psychological First Aid: Helping Others in Times of Stress is a basic-level web- based course that provides a framework for understanding the factors that affect stress responses in disaster relief workers and the clients they serve. The course introduces the principles of psychological first aid and guidelines for when to refer to a Disaster Mental Health worker. Participants engage in practice exercises and a review of the course content.

2. Everyone Is Welcome: (2/5/24) 20 minutes

- Everyone is Welcome is a basic web-based course that informs the learner about the Red Cross commitment to excellent service delivery to individuals with access and functional needs, including those with disabilities by inclusion and integration of their varied needs before, during, and after disasters. This course also provides tips for providing services to individuals with access and functional needs, including those with disabilities.
- The purpose of this course is to describe the concept of providing services to all
 clients and staff in a manner that recognizes the needs of those with disabilities and
 other access and functional needs. These efforts promote the inclusion of the whole
 community, so that everyone we serve, and all those we serve with, will feel
 welcome in all our service delivery and work site.
