Most people can get coverage for reproductive health services through Family Planning Medicaid if:

- You live in North Carolina
- You are a citizen or qualified immigrant
- You can become pregnant or cause a pregnancy
- Your household income* falls in the chart below:

Single adult	\$2,543 per month, or \$30,518 per year
Family of 2	\$3,437 per month, or \$41,243 per year
Family of 3	\$4,331 per month, or \$51,968 per year
Family of 4	\$5,224 per month, or \$62,693 per year
Family of 5	\$6,118 per month, or \$73,418 per year
Family of 6	\$7,012 per month, or \$84,143 per year
Family of 7	\$7,906 per month, or \$94,868 per year
Family of 8	\$8,799 per month, or \$105,593 per year

Covered reproductive health services:

- Nearly all birth control methods, including:
 - The pill
 - The patch
 - The Depo Provera shot
 - Intrauterine devices (IUDs)
 - Arm implants (Nexplanon)
 - Emergency contraception with a prescription
 - Permanent sterilization (vasectomy or tubes tied)
 - The pill, including Opill over-the-counter
 - Condoms from a provider office
 - Spermicides with a prescription
- Annual physical plus six follow-up visits
- Labs such as pregnancy tests and pap smears
- Sexually transmitted infection (STI) testing and treatment
- The HPV vaccine to prevent cancer
- Transportation to and from appointments
